Applicant and Dependants	
Copy of the passport including the photo page of passport and any pages with amendments, endorsements, visas and entry/exit stamps for all applicants included in the application.	
One passport sized photo of each applicant	
National ID card (RG), where relevant	
CPF card (Brazilian taxpayer number), where relevant	
Copy of birth certificates for each applicant (with certified English translation)	
Evidence of change of name (if applicable) (with certified English translation)	
For Brazilian males – copy of Military Discharge/Dispense Certificate (Certificado de Dispensa De Incorporação) as all males are required to register for military service at the age of 18 years old	
Evidence of your relationship to the New Zealand citizen	
Evidence that the New Zealand citizen holds or is eligible for a Special Category visa. This can	
include:	
Certified copy of the New Zealand citizen's birth certificate; or	
Certified copy of the New Zealand passport	
A recent passport sized photo of the New Zealand citizen	
Evidence that shows that you are a member of the family unit of the New Zealand citizen. This can	
include:	
Certified copies of birth certificates for each person claiming a relationship with the New Zealand citizen;	
Certified copy of marriage certificates;	
Certified copy of marriage certificates, Certified copy of death certificates for a previous spouse	
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Dependants under 18 years	
For children travelling without one or both parents or legal guardians, provide:	
A copy of each non-travelling parent's ID card (showing photograph and signature); and	
A completed Form 1229 from the non-travelling parent(s) giving consent for the child to migrate	
to Australia.	ĺ

Dependants 18 years and over	
Evidence of financial dependency on the New Zealand citizen or the New Zealand citizen's partner	
for their basic needs of food, shelter and clothing, and how long this support has been provided.	
Relationship Documentation	
If you are applying for a New Zealand Citizen family relationship visa on the basis of marriage, you need to provide a copy of your marriage certificate.	
If you are applying for a New Zealand Citizen family relationship visa on the basis of a de facto relationship, you will need to provide evidence that you have been in the relationship, and living together for 12 months before lodging the application. If the New Zealand Citizen and/or applicant were previously married, all pages of divorce/annulment documents that show details of any child custody arrangement, or a death certificate for a previous spouse.	
Statement from the applicant and New Zealand Citizen outlining the history and development of their relationship	
 Supporting documentation showing the genuine nature of relationship which may include: Copies of cards/letter which you have sent to one another including the envelops Copies of telephone accounts showing phone calls made to each other A selection of coloured photocopies of photos together over the length of the relationship Copies of any money transfers between the couple showing a shared financial history Any other evidence of the relationship and its duration 	
Character	
Penal (police) clearances for all applicants aged 18 years and over from each country in which the applicant has spent a total of 12 months or more in the last 10 years since turning 16 years of age. See <u>Character Requirements</u> , <u>Penal Clearance Certificates</u> for further information regarding appropriate penal clearances. See <u>Brazil police checks</u> for instructions on obtaining the correct police clearances from Brazil.
