For children travelling without one or both parents or legal guardians, provide: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A copy of each non-travelling parent’s ID card (showing photograph and signature); and</li> <li>• A completed <a href="#">Form 1229</a> from the non-travelling parent(s) giving consent for the child to migrate to Australia.</li> <li>• Custody documents – If no formal custody arrangements are in place, then non-travelling parent must provide public declaratory deed (Escritura Publica Declaratoria) (with certified English translation)</li> </ul>	<input type="checkbox"/>
<b>Dependants 18 years and over</b>	
Evidence of financial dependency on the sponsor for their basic needs of food, shelter and clothing, and how long this support has been provided.	<input type="checkbox"/>
If the applicant is a full-time student, evidence of their enrolment and active participation in a post-secondary course of study and evidence of all studies undertaken since turning 18 years of age.	<input type="checkbox"/>
If the child is not a full-time student, a written explanation of why they are not studying.	<input type="checkbox"/>

<b>Relationship Documentation</b>	
For Partner (309/100) on the basis of marriage, a copy of marriage certificate. If married in Australia, certificate must be issued by the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages	<input type="checkbox"/>
For Partner (309) on the basis of a <a href="#">de facto relationship</a> , evidence that the applicant and sponsor have been in the relationship and living together for 12 months before lodging the application.	<input type="checkbox"/>
For Prospective Marriage (300): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A letter from an authorised marriage celebrant or Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages indicating that a "Notice of Intended Marriage" has been lodged in Australia, including the date and place the wedding is to be held within nine months of the visa; and</li> <li>• Evidence that the applicant and sponsor have met face-to-face as adults and are personally known to each other.</li> </ul>	<input type="checkbox"/>
If the sponsor and/or applicant were previously married, all pages of divorce/annulment documents that show details of any child custody arrangement, or a death certificate for a previous spouse.	<input type="checkbox"/>
Statement from the applicant and sponsor outlining the history and development of their relationship	<input type="checkbox"/>
Supporting documentation showing the genuine nature of relationship which may include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Financial commitment such as evidence of joint accounts, money transfers or jointly held assets</li> <li>• Nature of the household such as rental receipts, shared expenses and joint household purchases</li> <li>• Social context of the relationship such as copies of photos over the course of the relationship, evidence that of declaration of relationship to government bodies or institutions, joint membership in organisations and joint travel</li> <li>• Nature of commitment to each other such as phone, internet or social media communication over the course of the relationship</li> </ul>	<input type="checkbox"/>
